

THE INFLUENCE OF ECONOMIC LIBERALISM ON COUNTRIES IN TRANSITION

Summary: Speaking about economic liberalism which has taken direction towards the concept of free trade and towards the doctrine connected with it about laissez-faire, one shall have in mind that it focused all its strength towards removing all economic barriers which have grown inside and between the countries on one side, and towards the fight against all forms of organizations from antique societies up to new syndicates on the other side.
